

The Graduate REALTOR Institute is a national continuing education program offered by the Texas Association of REALTORS (TAR). Graduates have completed three 30-hour courses of instruction (90 hours total) in specialized subjects, such as legal issues, finance, marketing, real estate investments, professional standards and technology tools. Less than 10 percent of TAR's 70,000 members have earned their GRI designation.

The GRI designation is a mark of excellence that signifies the graduate is a cut above other real estate practitioners. It represents the knowledge and professionalism needed to perform successfully in today's complex real estate field.

The term REALTOR is a registered and protected trademark. A REALTOR is a member of the National Association of REALTORS, his or her state association REALTORS and a local board or association of REALTORS. By joining the REALTOR organization, a real estate professional pledges to adhere to a strict code of ethics and high standards of professionalism, integrity and competence. Although anyone can take the GRI courses, only REALTORS who complete all three GRI courses can use the GRI designation.
